# Final FY2024 Allocations

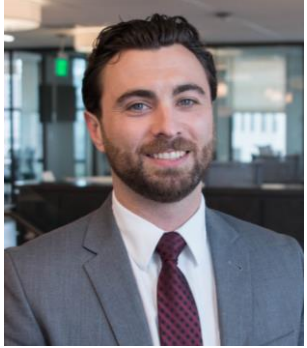

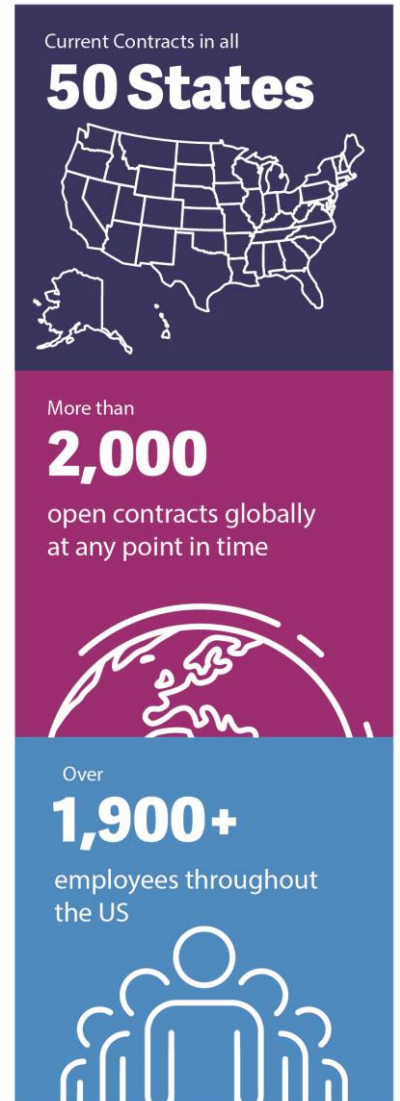

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# Monitoring Open Projects

- Title I, Part A is a 27-month grant.
- Multiple projects are open at any given time.
- Each open project must be monitored during its entire period of performance to ensure:
  - Funds are being spent in a timely fashion
  - Funds are being spent in line with the approved application
  - Rank and serve order is being followed
  - Alignment between the GMAP application and MUNIS is maintained
  - Established deadlines are met

# Procedures to Monitor Spending

- All districts must have documentation of the process used to effectively monitor the expenditure of funds in meeting the 15% carryover provision.
- The process could be easily expanded to include monitoring spending of funds beyond meeting the 15% carryover provision.
  - Spending in line with the approved application
  - Spending down all funds before the expiration date
- Consider incorporating...
  - Regular review of the district balances spreadsheet
  - Regular GMAP/MUNIS comparison

# District Balances Spreadsheet

- The district balances spreadsheet is sent to finance officers from KDE's Division of Budget and Financial Management each month.
- The workbook includes a separate tab for each federal fiscal year with information on several different grants.
  - Total budget
  - Expenditures
  - Balance
