### **Termination Statuses**

We have completed 82% of senior terminations at this point. I will be sending emails to those schools that are not yet at 100% next week. Terminations are responsible for most of our Perkins Accountability, so it is extremely important that these get completed as soon as possible. Remember that all seniors (active and inactive) require a termination status in TEDS.

### **Federal Indicators**

We received many questions about this topic at summer conference. Federal Indicators do not affect Career Readiness, but they do control Perkins Accountability. All students must have one and only one federal indicator at each institution. Non-seniors only affect non-traditional participation. Senior Preparatory students affect all other Perkins Accountability data. I have attached the federal indicator guide again for your use in helping make determinations.

### **Preparatory Status**

A student who has completed two career and technical education credits in a preparatory program and is enrolled in the third credit course(s). Please note that this states three credits and not courses and that all three credits must be in the same career pathway. If you have students that meet this requirement that are still marked exploring, they need to be switched to preparatory. The opposite is also true...If you have students that do not meet these requirements, then they must be marked exploring.

### **College and/or Career Readiness**

The most points that can possibly be earned by a student are 1.5 points. If the student is College Ready, the school would receive one point. If the student is College and Career Ready, the school would receive 1.5 points. A student can only be career ready or college and career ready if they are a CTE preparatory student. WorkKeys/ASVAB/Industry Certification data can only be entered on CTE students and will only count for preparatory CTE students.

### **KOSSA Import**

The import of data will be conducted at the end of July. If you have changes that need to be made to SSIDs on the KOSSA report you were sent from Pamela Moore, please submit the student name, litho #, and the SSID to [Pamela.Moore@education.ky.gov](mailto:Pamela.Moore@education.ky.gov) by July 26<sup>th</sup>.

### **WorkKeys Import**

We imported WorkKeys last week with a 90% success rate. All schools should verify that their WorkKeys data imported correctly. If you are missing any WorkKeys data, you should enter this information through the career readiness screen in TEDS. Please remember that if the data is not correct in TEDS, it will not be correct for Career Readiness.

### **[13-14 Industry Certification and KOSSA List](#)**

On July 9<sup>th</sup> the 2013-2014 Valid Industry Certification and KOSSA List was posted to the KDE website. It can be found by [clicking here](#). There are numerous changes to the list this year, so please check all career pathways offered at your institution against the new list. Many new pathways have been added and several pathways were removed. We also made changes to several CIP Code numbers on the list. Please read below for information on CIP Code changes. It is important to remember though that these changes do not go into effect until we report on 13-14 data.

### **13-14 CIP Code Changes**

My apologies as I incorrectly stated in a session at Summer Conference that the Career Pathway/CIP Code List was not changing much for 13-14. In fact there are some major changes to the pathways for 13-14, two of which are STEM pathways have been added/deleted for 13-14 and Health Science pathways have been added/deleted. With that said, and one apology out of the way, I will apologize again because I cannot give you the final list in this email. I will be sending out a separate email about all of these changes later this month. The email will contain procedures for getting changes made for your school in TEDS and will also have the new list attached for your use. Please look for that communication in the next two weeks.

### **KOSSA Changes for 13-14**

If you did not attend the summer conference or if you attended, but did not attend a session that discussed KOSSA changes, know that KOSSA will be dramatically different for the 13-14 school year.
