

Memorandum of Articulation Agreement

**Kentucky Department of Education
College and Career Readiness Branch
and
Sullivan College of Technology and Design**

The **KDE College and Career Readiness Branch** and Sullivan College of Technology and Design (SCTD) entered into this Memorandum of Agreement on the 15th day of May, 2012. The **College and Career Readiness Branch** and Sullivan College of Technology and Design (SCTD) will work together to provide postsecondary opportunities for students represented by **The College and Career Readiness Branch** who want to continue their education at Sullivan College of Technology and Design.

General Agreement

The parties to this agreement may articulate courses designated in their written Program of Study within the Family and Consumer Sciences program area of Fashion and Interior Design. These courses of study shall conform to the written curriculum guidelines developed by the Joint Curriculum Committee:

Leslie Slaughter – Kentucky Department of Education
Sheree P. Koppel – Sullivan College of Technology and Design
Terri George – Sullivan College of Technology and Design

The parties further agree that the Programs of Study shall encourage the integration of technical and academic content in meaningful, applied ways, and that, when possible, instructors shall strive to relate classroom content to real-world situations and practices. Labs, projects and other “hands-on” activities are to be encouraged as instructional strategies.

In order to receive SCTD credit for a course taken at a public high school in Kentucky, a student must (1) earn a letter grade of “B” or better in the high school course, (2) successfully meet the entrance requirements at SCTD and (3) enroll at SCTD within one year of high school graduation. In addition, the student must (4) successfully complete one quarter of study on SCTD’s campus before advanced credit will appear on the college transcript.

The courses and course objectives identified for this Articulation Agreement conform to the curriculum guidelines set forth by the Kentucky Department of Education in its **General Curriculum Guidelines**.

The courses that satisfy the requirements for advanced standing credit are:

Fashion and Interior Design I, II

In addition to these articulated classes, students who complete the Fashion and Interior Design career major in high school and take a CADD class as part of the sequence of courses for the career major may obtain credit for DRF135, CADD I, at the college. A student must take the appropriate bypass test at the college and earn a score of 85% or better to obtain this credit.

A student who comes to the college with IC3 certification will be eligible to bypass CCS117, Computer Fundamentals, at the college.

Depending on which courses a student completes to satisfy the Fashion and Interior Design career major, students may also have the knowledge and skills to take and score sufficiently high on bypass tests for IDD116, Drafting I, IDD131, Design History, and IDD152, Interior Finishes.

The parties to this agreement, **KDE College and Career Readiness Branch** and Sullivan College of Technology and Design personnel, will maintain relationships that will permit continued development, refinement, and implementation of all components of this articulation agreement, including evaluation, marketing, counseling, recruitment, and retention plans.

This agreement takes effect upon the affixing of signatures by each of the parties named below.

Duration of Review

This Memorandum of Agreement shall be effective from the date of affixing of signatures and shall be renewed annually one year from the date of origination. It remains subject to such revisions as are mutually agreeable at the time of annual review, but the duration of the agreement shall be considered continuous. Either party may terminate the agreement at the time of annual review provided the party has given written notice of intent to do so at least 90 days in advance.


