


## SELF-CORRECTING INSTRUCTION MATERIALS

### Ideas for helping students in mainstream classes

Self-correcting materials are those that provide the student with the correct answer so that responses can be checked for accuracy. Some examples would be flashcards for terms in a chapter with the term on one side and the definition on the back, or answer keys for independent practice activities. Below is one example of a self-correcting instructional material that can be used in your classroom to help your students succeed.



**Materials needed:** one manila folder, a worksheet containing problems and answers, and a felt-tip pen or grease pencil to write responses under the problem.

#### Construction:

1. Cut strips in one side of a manila folder, and then laminate it.
2. Construct a worksheet where if placed in the cut folder the answers would be covered by the manila strips.
3. Place worksheet in the folder with strips closed and allow student to complete the work. Student can then check their answers by pulling the worksheet upward to see if the answers written on the manila strip match the answer key.
