Essay Contest Guidelines:

1. Each individual school should hold its own local competition and select one entry that will compete at the state level. The contest is open to all Kentucky students in grades K-12.

For example: A elementary school holds a competition open to all grades and selects one overall winner from the school to compete at the state level.

2. State essay contest is limited to one entry per school.
3. Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) reserves the right to display student work according to available resources and in relation to the size, material, weight and content of the student essay.
4. Written essays that are not acceptable in a school district due to policy and practice also are not acceptable at the state level. If an essay violates internal health and safety regulations, the work will not be displayed. Schools submitting student essays are responsible for this compliance.
5. Schools must submit the essay entry with a completed entry form. All sections of the entry form must be completed to be eligible for consideration.
6. School must submit their essay entry by 4:30 p.m. ET February 15, 2013 to be eligible for consideration.
7. Essay entries must be submitted by mail to Kentucky Equine Youth Festival Essay Contest, ATTN: Cara Stewart, 4037 Ironworks Parkway, Suite130, Lexington, Kentucky 40511.

Essay Judging Criteria:

1. Essay entry is limited to 250 words.
2. All entries may be hand-written and/or typed.
3. All entries must be double-spaced.
4. Student and school names shall not appear anywhere in the body of the essay.
5. Essays will be judged on use of theme – What Horses Mean to Kentucky.
6. Essays will be scored on structure, development, persuasiveness, overall cohesiveness, spelling and sentence structure.
7. Essays may contain illustrations but the inclusion of illustrations will not be considered in the overall scoring of the essay.
