#### **The Principal as Conversationalist:**

***Give Powerful Feedback to Teachers to Enhance Their Effectiveness***

In this session, participants will begin to recognize disconnects between beliefs and behaviors in the performance appraisal process. They will understand how differentiated and developmental model of supervision will result in a school culture that values teachers' professionalism. The activities in this session will be focused on the Kentucky Framework that includes indicators of effective teaching and learning in four domains of practice:

- planning and preparation
- classroom environment
- instruction
- professional responsibilities

Using a growth mindset model championed by Carol Dwek, this session will also focus on strategies for professional learning during the life cycle of the career teacher.

#### **Redbook Training:**

***District Activity Funds & Fraud Protection***

Presented by school accounting expert, Ron Flannery, this session is designed to educate school and district administrators of the significant changes made to the newly revised *Accounting Procedures for Kentucky School Activity Funds* that became effective July 1, 2013. Ron will also discuss what money is required to be sent to the district as District Activity Funds, what money principals may choose to keep at the school, and what money is required to stay in the school activity fund account. It will also identify common fraud examples that occur in schools and which internal controls need to be followed to help minimize the risk of fraud occurring when dealing with activity fund money.
