YouthAlert! (YA!) End-Of-Presentation Student/Youth Survey Analysis: Out of 17,965 possible individual responses, 3,593 student/youth surveys, there were 691 total “No” answers, **3.8 percent**, which meets our goal of keeping this number under 10 percent. There were 13,950 total “Yes” answers, **77.7 percent**, and 3,282 total “A Little” answers,

18.3 percent. There were also **42** total “Blank” or “Write-In” answers, **0.2 percent.**

Question 1. 96.8 percent of students/youth surveyed, **3,478** of **3,593**, learned *something new* about violence in this presentation with **77.3 percent**, **2,777** of **3,593**, answering “Yes”.


Question 2. 95.6 percent of students/youth surveyed, **3,435** of **3,593**, said that they were *more aware* about the dangers of violence after this presentation with **77.8 percent**, **2,796** of **3,593**, answering “Yes”.

Question 3. 95.0 percent, of students/youth surveyed, **3,415** of **3,593**, said this presentation will help them avoid *being a victim* of violence with **75.8 percent**, **2,726** of **3,593**, answering “Yes”.

Question 4. 96.2 percent of the students/youth surveyed, **3,455** of the **3,593**, said this presentation will help *prevent them* from doing an act of violence, even if just a little, with over half, **83.3 percent**, **2,993** of **3,593**, answering “Yes”.

Question 5. 96.0 percent of student/youth surveyed, **3,449** of the **3,593**, said this presentation could help prevent *someone else* from doing an act violence, even if just “A Little”, with over half, **74.0 percent**, **2,658** of **3,593**, answering “Yes”.








