ICD-10 Conversion by Infinite Campus

- ▶ Infinite Campus converted 327 health conditions
 - Active ICD-9 codes were end dated
 - Health condition with corresponding ICD-10 code was created
 - Any User Warning or Flag on the ICD-9 record was duplicated on the new ICD-10 record
 - Health code preference was changed to ICD-10 in all districts




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KDE provided Infinite Campus with a crosswalk for 327 health condition codes. If a student had an active ICD-9 code on this crosswalk, the health condition was end dated and a new health condition with the corresponding ICD-10 health condition on the crosswalk was created. If the ICD-9 health condition had a User Warning or Flag attached to it, that was duplicated on the new ICD-10 condition.

NOTE: These ICD-9 health conditions will have a “Not Resolved” status, therefore they will show up RED on the student’s health condition tab.


ICD-10 Clean Up

- ▶ Districts will need to manually convert remaining health conditions with ICD-9 codes
- ▶ Begin by Running State Published Ad Hoc “Student Health codes with ICD-9 Code Set” to determine which students still have active ICD-9 health conditions



ICD-10 Clean Up

- ▶ Create a new health condition record for the active health condition with an ICD-10 code
 - Use the Search feature to find the new code
 - Make sure any User Warnings or Flags are duplicated on the new health condition
 - Click Save Condition



To search for the new code: Type the condition on the description search box and click on the magnifying glass. A list of ICD-10 codes will appear. Consult the list of recommended ICD-10 codes. Choose the correct code.

If you cannot find the condition you are looking for, OR the condition you choose is not-flagable (and you need it to be) – consult the additional information on the Health Services webpage: <http://education.ky.gov/districts/SHS/Pages/School-Health-Services-Infinite-Campus-Information.aspx>

What Health Data Is Required

- ▶ Physical Exams–Initial Entry and 6th grade
- ▶ Vision Exam – Initial entry (may accept Head Start or Preschool)
- ▶ Dental Exam– Entry into Kindergarten only
- ▶ Results of Hearing and Vision Screenings
- ▶ Immunizations–Certificate type, Certificate Date and Expiration Date



Data Clean Up for Reporting

▶ Reports to run monthly

◦ Immunization Certificate

- Only information KDE collects regarding immunizations is **certificate date, expiration date and certificate type**
- *Path: Health>Reports>Immunization Certificate*

◦ Health Screening Compliance

- Identifies students still missing required health screenings
- *Path: Health>Reports>Health Screening Compliance*



Immunization Certificate: THIS IS THE BEST REPORT TO HELP YOU KEEP UP TO DATE ON STUDENT IMMUNIZATION STATUS

Individual immunization compliance is not monitored or required for KDE reporting. For state reporting purposes, a student must have a valid (unexpired) immunization certificate.

Infinite Campus maintains compliance rules on individual immunizations based on federal CDC guidelines. Districts may enter individual immunization dates to make the completion of the yearly Division of Public Health Immunization survey much easier.

Troubleshooting screening data: If a screening is not included on the report, refer to Health Data Standards or 2015-16 Health Data Entry for EOY Reports for guidelines on accurately entering screening data.

Health Conditions and Health Alerts

- ▶ **Chronic Health Conditions** – Chronic health conditions that require a health service during school hours or during a school sponsored event should be entered as a health condition on a student's record
- ▶ **Health Alerts** – Chronic health conditions that may require an emergency action, such as administration of Gluagon, Diastat, Asthma Inhaler or Epi-Pen, should have the condition flagged to create a health alert



End of the year Reporting

- ▶ School health data will be pulled by KDE on June 1st, 2016
 - Districts do not need to pull and/or email the data
- ▶ Please review all health data at the end of the school year before the data pull
- ▶ Data will be posted on Open House after September 1, 2016
