





Annually, the Kentucky Department of Education collects geographical coordinates from the front door of each public school in Kentucky. Originally, this collection updated the geographical coordinates that had been previously collected by Area Development Districts in 2007. Schools and districts participated in the Front Door Project as an Earth Day activity. This was the first data collection of this type by the department.

[Kentucky's Commonwealth Map](#) now reflects the latest Global Positioning System (GPS) coordinates for Kentucky Public Schools. You can search schools on the Commonwealth Map link to see the mapped coordinates. The Commonwealth Office of Technology shares these coordinates on request to public and private entities.

As a school location changes or new schools open, schools are asked to complete a School Change Request Form located [here](#), and also follow the instructions below to update the GPS coordinates. School location files will be generated at the end of each quarter for Commonwealth Maps as updates are received. Completed School Change Request forms should be sent to lori.davis@education.ky.gov.

As coordinates change, schools can update the coordinates by following the [instruction document](#) using the Commonwealth Map.



Student Privacy

- ▶ How are contracts reviewed to ensure compliance with FERPA?

eTranscripts

- ▶ **All public high schools now live!**
- ▶ Focus shifting from transition to usage
- ▶ All final transcripts expected to be electronic. Some universities have indicated they will no longer accept paper transcripts.
- ▶ Minor changes to transcript format to ensure consistent layout. Example class rank – displays but only filled if districts populate.
- ▶ ACT does not allow use of KDE loaded national scores on transcript.

NEW Requirements for 2014–15

Alternative Programs / ILPA

- ▶ Use of the ILPA module in IC for tracking transition of students to/from alternative schools is **REQUIRED** beginning 2014–15,
- ▶ The ILPA module is available for all districts via user security set-up


Early Graduation

- ▶ **Early Graduation – Intent to Graduate Early Beginning 2014–15**
 - Senate Bill 61 provides a pathway to Early Graduation for students who intend to move on an accelerated timeline through high school and graduate college ready before the typical four years of high school or age 18.
 - Student Incentives:
 - Early Graduation Certificate
 - One-time scholarship award to be used at a SACS accredited Kentucky two- or four-year public or non-profit college.
 - The equivalent of four years of KEES (Kentucky Educational Excellence Scholarship) as calculated and administered by KHEAA for students who graduate in three years.

Educator Development System

- ▶ 2013–14 Pilot Year
- ▶ 2014–15 Statewide rollout
- ▶ Infinite Campus data used to feed CIITS
- ▶ Quality data needed
 - Teacher of Record
 - Contributing Professional
 - Student Voice
- ▶ Roles & Permissions must be in Campus for to access CIITS

- **Required for use 2014-2015 for**


- All seniors who fell short of ACT benchmarks

Kentucky Tech System Pilot

- ▶ KTS/Infinite Campus Data Exchange
 - Transfer of student records from high school to tech school.
 - Transfer of attendance and grades from tech school to high school.
 - Eliminates duplicate data entry for both schools.
 - Allows tech schools to fully utilize functionality in IC and CIITS.
 - Tech Schools required to use EDS in 2015–16.
- ▶ 10 participating pilot schools
 - 9 Area Technology Centers – Breckinridge, Carroll, Casey, Floyd, Fulton, Garrard, Green, Lincoln, Pulaski
 - 1 Career Tech Centers – Franklin
- ▶ 2014–15 Pilot Year; 2015–16 full participation



Restraint & Seclusion



- ▶ New functionality for tracking Restraint & Seclusion coming this summer.
- ▶ Custom tab for 2013–14 but will not be used going forward.
- ▶ 2013–14 data quality issues may delay public reporting.

FRAM – Point of Sale (POS) End of Year (EOY) –Procedures


1. Stop the POS import of 13-14 data in IC
before July 1, 2014



2. Roll forward your POS for
SY 14-15



3. Change the year to 14-15 in the IC data
import mapping



4. Turn the data synchronization back on
between your POS and IC



FRAM/POS EOY Checklist



- ✓ Verify your data synchronization has been stopped **before** any rollover with the POS system
- ✓ After the POS rollover re-start the scheduled import process
- ✓ Check the scheduled import tool log file on a monthly basis
- ✓ Compare free, reduced and paid counts from the FRAM Eligibility report to the POS system; investigate any large differences

State Course Codes

- Why does it matter?
 - Defines certification requirements for LEAD reporting
 - Identifies courses requiring End-of-Course Assessment
 - Identifies Intervention courses
 - Identifies AP courses for increased KEES money
 - Used to analyze course progressions across districts
- How do I make sure they are correct?
 - To identify blank or totally invalid state course codes
KY State Reporting > KDE Reports > Missing or Invalid Course State Codes
 - To check for mismatched state course codes
Ad Hoc Reporting > State Published > curriculum State Course Codes
