



FEDERAL REPORTING EDFACTS

Federal program offices use *EDFacts* data to meet their data collection requirements from State Education Agencies (SEAs) for programmatic reports to Congress, and for statistical research. The National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) uses *EDFacts* data for the non-fiscal Common Core of Data (CCD).

Timeliness of *EDFacts* submissions is critical. Due dates are provided for all files in the *EDFacts* File Due Dates list available at www.ed.gov/edfacts. Many other resources for *EDFacts* submissions are also available on this web page.

DATA QUALITY STARTS WITH DATA OWNERS

Data Steward: owner of a data element or data field responsible for hands-on work related to data at KDE.

The person in the school or district that should (a) be the expert of what that particular data element means/does, (b) is the person that answers detailed questions/issues about that data element and (c) lastly regularly inspects (you get what you inspect versus expect) the level of quality to ensure it meets not only their needs but all the others that depend on it.

The data steward for each key data element arrives each day knowing they have the responsibility for the accuracy of each data element that they have been assigned. This responsibility is not only within their school or district but also to others outside their district that count on the accuracy of the data.

Assessment Pushdown

- ACT, Explore, Plan (2011)
 - Pushdown to districts in February
 - Will create State Assessment Scores – even for districts that have already loaded – necessary for scores to be included in student records transfer.
- Access (2011)
 - Mid February
- Explore, Plan (2012)
 - Expected Spring 2012
- ACT (2012)
 - Expected Summer 2012

AD HOC STATE LIBRARY

A folder, named State Published, was placed in ad hoc reporting in August of 2011. This new function allows the KDE to create ad hoc filters and push them down to districts.
