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Intent for Early Graduation deadline is Oct. 1

All students planning to complete the Early Graduation Program must complete the <u>Intent for Early Graduation</u> (<u>IEG) form</u> and be flagged in Infinite Campus prior to the Oct. 1 deadline. New Communicable Disease tab

The new Communicable Disease Tab allows school nurses to document reportable communicable diseases in the school. The school nurse should notify the local health department or other medical providers regarding students with certain communicable diseases. Having this documentation in the student information system will allow school nurses to easily track all reported illnesses. It is not mandatory that this tab be used if the district has another policy or protocol for documenting reported communicable diseases.

To access the new Communicable Disease tab, user access must be granted by the district KSIS administrator. Path: Student Information/Communicable Disease

Attendance codes for influenza-like symptoms

The Cabinet for Health and Family Services (CHFS) is expecting a high number of influenza cases this year and has asked the Division of District Support to provide weekly aggregate counts of influenza-related absences during the 2022-2023 school year. The four attendance codes below are outlined in the Pupil Attendance Manual and should be used in the event of student absences due to influenza-like illness.

- ILID Influenza-like illness excused doctor note
- ILIP Influenza-like illness excused parent note

ILIE – Influenza-like illness excused

ILIU – Influenza-like illness unexcused

Last year 33 districts missed the Nov. 1 deadline. This year, the Office of Teaching and Learning would like to increase the number of districts that submit this information based on the legislation above.

Growth Factor submission time is almost here

The *Growth Factor Report* is due to KDE ten days after the last day of the second school month and no later than Nov. 1 of each school year. The report is mandatory for each district to complete and helps identify districts with growth to determine additional funding. KDE will send official notice to each district.

Growth Factor will not generate any funding for the 2022-2023 school year and will serve as a baseline to resume funding for the 2023-2024 school year.

The report includes:

- Aggregate day's attendance and absence
- Race and gender counts
- Adjustments for less than full-time attendance (partial day)
- Non-resident/non-contract students
- Overage and underage students for the first two months of school

Districts should submit the *Growth Factor Report* by clicking the *Submit Growth Factor Report* hyperlink on the <u>KDE Growth Factor Reports webpage</u>. For additional information on the new SAAR application, refer to the <u>2022-23 Growth Factor Guidance Manual</u>. Directors of pupil personnel (DPP's) will be notified of an online training for the new SAAR system. The training will be held on Monday Sept. 26 at 2 pm (ET). New assessment data visualization dashboards coming soon

KDE is working with Computer Information Concepts (CIC) to add new assessment data visualizations to dashboards currently available (demographic, attendance, behavior and equity). Visualizations will include Kentucky Performance Rating for Educational Progress (KPREP) and Kentucky Summative Assessments (KSA) will be added when that data is available this fall. The American College Test (ACT) scores will be available in a separate dashboard. Initially, one year of KPREP and three years of ACT scores will be available. All dashboards will include filters for student group, grade level and demographics. The visualizations will show currently enrolled students. The data visualizations will be introduced in two phases.

Phase one will be available by the end of Sept. and includes:

- State Assessment Summary bar charts displaying district, school and grade level detail
- State Assessments by Students bar charts displaying individual student scores by subject with benchmark indicators reflected
- ACT College Readiness Analysis ACT results with bar charts displaying district and school outcomes (<u>CPE Kentucky Academic Readiness Decision Band</u> is used as a measure.)
- ACT College Readiness by Student individual level detail on ACT scores reflecting CPE benchmark measure Phase two will be available by the end of Oct. and includes:
 - KSA Demographic Analysis a bubble chart that will allow comparison of scores against two demographic filters as well as up to two school years
 - KSA Summary Comparison color coded bar graphs showing several years of KSA summary data side-by-side
 - KSA Multi-Year Student Profile allows schools to assess the progress of one student for multiple years in all subjects on one page with color coded bar graphs

Title III - English Learners and Immigrant data quality review

Districts are advised to monitor data quality frequently by running periodic data quality checks to ensure reports are error-free. The Infinite Campus *English Learner* extract is used to determine the English Learner (EL) counts for every district. KDE runs this extract multiple times throughout the year for federal reporting requirements as well as determining Title III allocation amounts.

Information and step-by-step instructions regarding the creation and maintenance of EL student records are in the English Learner Data Standard. For EL and Immigrant program reporting timelines, reference Section G of the Immigrant Data Standard.

Learner Data Standard and Section C of the Immigrant Data Standard.

Data quality issues cause errors that result in students not appearing on the *English Learner* extract and exclusion from the districts' EL student counts. Below are some tips to avoid common errors.

- Home Primary Language Students whose home primary language is left blank or listed as English will not be included in the extract. The home primary language is based on the information provided on the Home
 Language Survey (HLS) completed upon the student's initial enrollment in a Kentucky public school district. This information should not be changed if the student transfers to another Kentucky district or when the student exits the EL program.
- EL Services Students must have at least one active EL Service type to be considered an EL student for reporting purposes. EL services should not be end-dated each year.
- EL Instructional Accommodations Students must have at least one active EL Instructional Accommodation to be considered an EL student for reporting purposes. EL accommodations should not be end-dated each year.
- End date EL services and accommodations should only be end-dated if the student exits EL program status, or the student no longer needs the service or accommodation based on an update to the student's EL Program Services Plan (PSP). For students who exit EL program status based on reaching attainment on the annual ACCESS assessment, the end date should be June 30 of the year in which the student reached attainment.
- EL student transfers between districts The Student Records Transfer process is summarized in <u>Section F of the</u>
 <u>English Learner Data Standards</u> and expanded guidance is available in the <u>Student Records Transfer Data</u>
 Standard.
- Date Entered U.S. School field The <u>Immigrant Data Standard</u> and the IC *Title III Immigrant KDE Report* should be used to ensure the Date Entered U.S. School field is accurately completed.

KSA and PSR assessments in Infinite Campus

In October, Kentucky Summative Assessments (KSA) and Postsecondary Readiness (PSR) test scores will be available in Infinite Campus. Scores for KSA, KSA-Alternate, PSR and PSR-Alternate in Infinite Campus will appear in new templates separate from historical Kentucky Performance Rating for Education Progress (KPREP) scores. A new Postsecondary Readiness template will also be added. KDE reports in Infinite Campus will also be updated to reflect KSA and Postsecondary Readiness.

Custom Assessment Report scheduled to be sunset
