



Health Inspections

Policy/Procedure Number: GA-2013-02

As required by section 9(g) of the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act and Federal regulations at 7 CFR 210.13 and 7 CFR 220.7, all schools participating in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and School Breakfast Program (SBP) must obtain two food safety inspections from the State or local governmental agency responsible for food safety inspections.

This inspection requirement applies to all food preparation-service sites and service-only sites and State Agencies must report all sites in the annual report submitted to USDA. The scope of the food safety inspection may vary according to the type of food service operation and is determined by the agency responsible for inspections.

Each site is required to have a minimum of two health inspections. It is the districts responsibility to notify the health department if they have not had a second inspection in a timely manner in order to stay within this regulation. Documentation should be kept on file if notification to the health department was made.

Breakfast in the Classroom has been great way to increase breakfast participation. Health inspections are not completed at these individual sites within the schools. Each school will need to have a HACCP plan within their manual that includes procedures for this activity. Health inspections are to be reported yearly to SCN and are checked during CRE/AR reviews.
