

What to Do About Bullying In Your School

First, we highly recommend that you evaluate your Safe Schools Report, your [School Report Card](#), your in-house behavior data, or any other data that you may have to determine if you need to focus on bullying prevention. **Keep in mind that the best bullying prevention programs are those that either concentrate on creating a positive school climate or work in tandem with a positive school climate program.**

The following are merely suggestions for educators to consider when evaluating quality bullying prevention programs. There are other programs available. You must find what it best for your school and your students.
