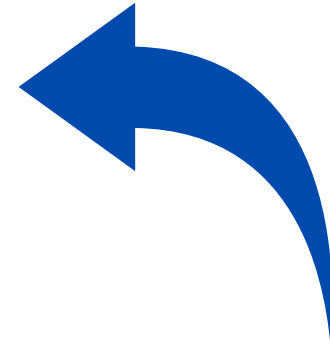
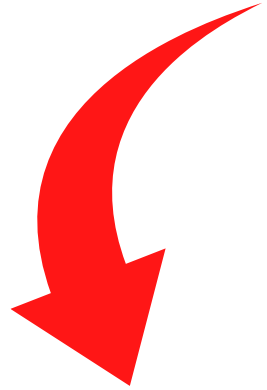


### Educators

- Emphasize the “individual” in ILP as this is about our students’ future. What they will be doing after they graduate- after they leave our guidance. It is individualized as each student will move through their careers and lives in their own unique ways.
- Beyond compliance, the ILP provides activities and opportunities for our students to engage and own their post-secondary planning. What will they do after graduation? What resources do they have? Are they truly college and/or career ready?
- The ILP progressively helps students develop their schedule of courses and workforce skills annually.
- The ILP has become a process far beyond asking students to answer the following question: What do you want to be when you grow up?



### Students

- YOU are the Individual within the Individual Learning Plan!
- YOU can have a voice in your future including high school courses, extracurricular opportunities, postsecondary plans, etc.
- The ILP is a process...not just a document. YOU will explore a variety of options based on your strengths, talents, hobbies and skill sets.
- Develop workforce skills such as time management, handling daily stresses, financial planning, leadership and collaborating with others.
- Knowledge is power. Use Kentucky Center for Statistics or KYSTATS to better understand the financial investment it will take to study or be an apprentice in your chosen career. It’s also important for you to understand current average incomes for your chosen career path and how salaries can vary across Kentucky and the United States.

## Individual Learning Plan (ILP) Stakeholder Talking Points



### Families

- Ideally students will have a better understanding of themselves and their goals and this will minimize them waiting until college to explore options.
- Financial planning is completed within the ILP to help families save money and lead students to explore different ways of paying for post-secondary education or becoming an apprentice. This also helps students explore the many financial benefits of joining the military.
- Collaboration between families and the school will ensure student success for their post-secondary options.
- By law (see [704 KAR 3:305](#)), “A school shall maintain each student’s individual learning plan. The individual learning plan shall be readily available to the student and parent and reviewed and approved at least annually by the student, parents and school officials.”
