Inform the student that the task is about to start by saying, "We are about to start the task, and I am going to ask you some questions."

All questions from this task are available for presentation to the student in the supplemental material <u>Reading 10 B Attainment Task</u> <u>Questions for Student Use</u>.

Explain to the student that they will be reading a passage and will then answer a few questions about the passage. Present the student with <u>Reading 10 B Setting Sail for Summer (Reading 10 B Setting Sail for Summer Picture Board</u> may be presented as a support for the student). Have the student read, or read to the student, the passage <u>Reading 10 B Setting Sail for Summer</u>.

2. "From the text, the reader knows that Max is supposed to stay with the neighbor while Maria and her family go on vacation. What can we **infer** about the neighbor?"

Response Rationale	
The student understands and identifies the inference that for the neighbor to be willing to keep the dog, they probably like dogs.	
The student understands the family is going on vacation and incorrectly infers that the neighbor is going too.	
The student understands the family is going sailing and incorrectly infers the neighbor must not like sailing.

¹Every summer Maria's family takes a vacation at the end of school. ²In the past, they have explored the campgrounds of Yellowstone National Park, whitewater rafted down the Colorado River, and basked in the sunshine on the beaches of Key West in Florida. ³This year, Maria's family is going sailing on the coast. ⁴Only one thing will be different: Maria's dog, Max, will have to stay behind.

⁵Max is a Labrador Retriever who helps Maria every day. ⁶The idea of leaving Max with her neighbor while she goes sailing makes Maria very nervous. She isn't used to doing things without Max's help. Max senses that Maria is nervous and wants to help her.

Maria takes Max to the neighbor's house while her mom loads the van. Maria hugs Max and sighs as she leaves him with the neighbor and sadly goes back into her house. Maria's mother leaves the back van door open as she loads the van. ⁷While everybody is inside, Max slips out of the neighbor's yard and into the back of the van where he hides quietly under a blanket. Maria's mom puts the last bag in the back of the van and closes the door. A few hours later, they arrive at the sailboat.

⁸As they unpack the van, Max jumps from his hiding place and stands at Maria's side. "Oh Max!" Maria exclaimed, "I am so happy you are here! Now this truly will be the best vacation!" ⁹The captain placed his hat atop Max's head, and the whole family laughed!
