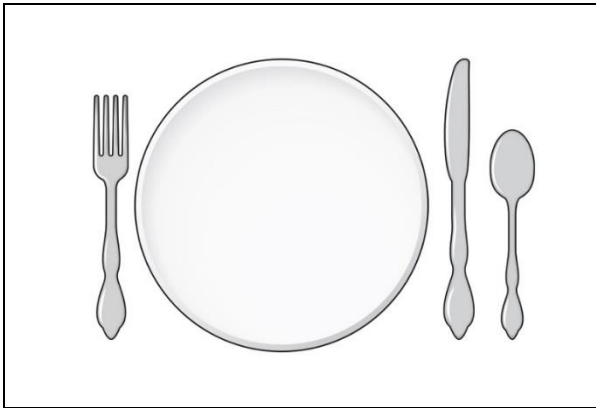

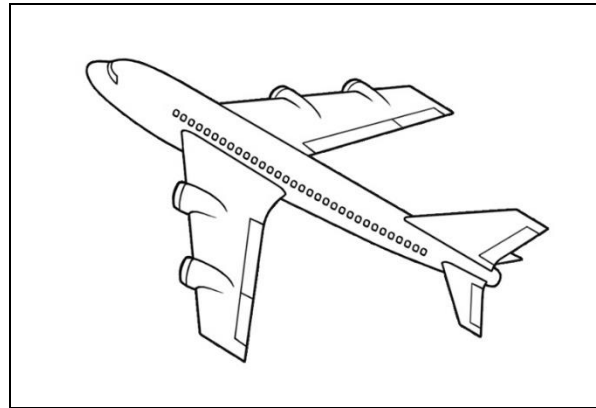

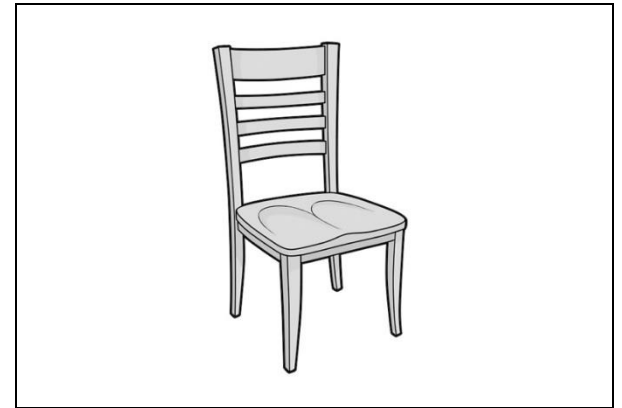

Before beginning task administration, please ensure that all conditions specified in the administration protocol (starting on page 10 of the Administration Guide Overview and Attainment Task Administration) have been met. Inform the student that the task is about to start by saying, “We are about to start the task, and I am going to ask you some questions.”

All questions from this task are available for presentation to the student in the supplemental material Reading 10 A Attainment Task Questions for Student Use.

Explain to the student that they will be reading a passage and will then answer a few questions about the passage. Present the student with Reading 10 A The Butterfly Garden (Reading 10 A The Butterfly Garden Picture Board may be presented as a support for the student). Have the student read, or read to the student, the passage Reading 10 A The Butterfly Garden.

Present the student with Reading 10 A Monarch Butterfly Photograph. The test administrator should highlight or direct the student’s attention to the proboscis.

“In *The Butterfly Garden*, Lola’s favorite pictures were ones of the butterflies on the flowers.”

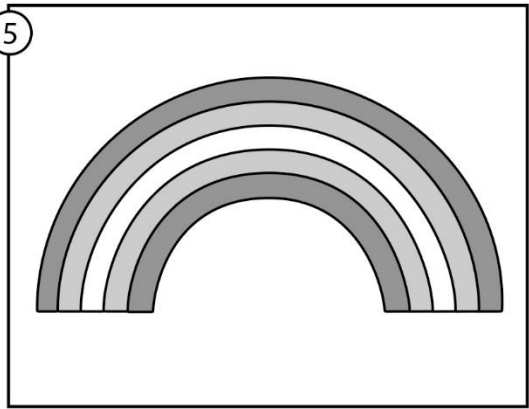
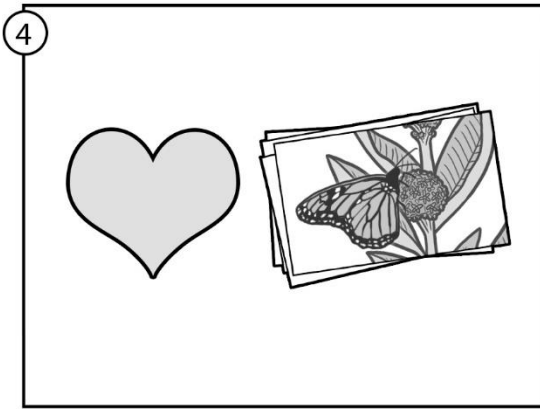
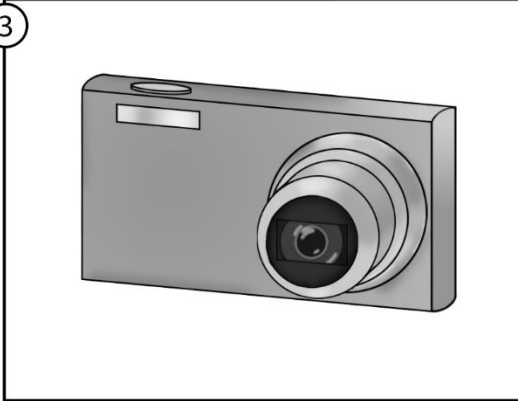
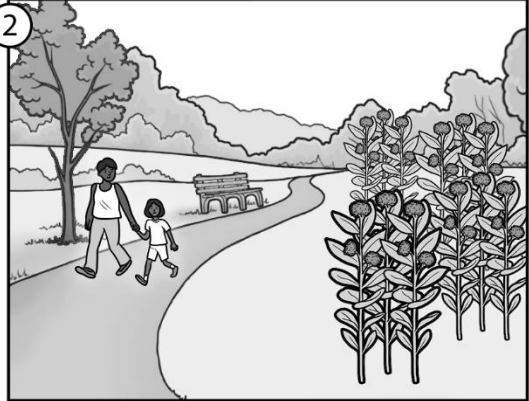
2. “The *Monarch Butterfly Photograph* shows a monarch butterfly sitting on a milkweed plant. The butterfly’s proboscis (tongue) is also pictured. What is the butterfly **likely** doing in the *Monarch Butterfly Photograph* that is **not** discussed in *The Butterfly Garden*?”

Response Option	Response Rationale
a. Eating (Correct)	<i>The student compares the passage and the photograph and correctly observes that the butterfly is eating in the photograph but not in the passage.</i>
b. Flying	<i>The student compares the passage and the photograph but does not recognize that the butterflies only fly in the passage and not in the photograph.</i>
c. Sitting	<i>The student compares the passage and the photograph but does not realize that the butterflies sit on flowers in both the passage and in the photograph.</i>
