Have the student read, or read to the student, the passage <u>Reading 6 C The Two Princesses</u>.

After the king made his decision, the older daughter began to watch her younger sister. ⁷She realized her kindness made people happy. ⁸She saw that her sister's concern for people led them to love her. ⁹She began to understand that love was necessary to rule.
