Agenda Item: Welcome

Presenter: Thomas Woods Tucker, Ph.D., Deputy Commissioner of Education, Kentucky Department of Education

Summary of Discussion: Tucker announced the partnership between the KDE and the U.S. Army Cadet Command to start a pilot program for a statewide junior ROTC program, with Col. Tim McDonald as the state director for Army Instruction.

Tucker highlighted Kristen Hibbert's recognition as the 2024 Kentucky Special Education Teacher of the Year and shared her career journey and achievements.

Tucker announced that more than 50 Kentucky schools were certified as family-friendly by the Prichard Committee, with Gov. Andy Beshear signing a proclamation for Family Engagement in Education Week.

Tucker shared that the U.S. Department of Labor recognized the Kentucky Department of Education for its commitment to apprenticeship programs, with the Office of Career and Technical Education receiving an Apprenticeship Ambassador Certificate of Recognition.

Tucker announced that the Office of Teaching and Learning won a competitive grant called the Kentucky Comprehensive Literacy Grant, which will provide funding for instructional resources and professional learning to improve literacy rates.

He mentioned the formation of a committee by Lt. Gov. Jacqueline Coleman to address mental health issues, particularly at the middle school level, and encouraged students to provide input.

Tucker informed the participants that nominations for the 2026 Kentucky Teacher of the Year are now being accepted and encouraged students to nominate their favorite teachers.

Summary of Discussion: Sircy led a mindful minute session, discussing different types of stress, the stress cycle and techniques for stress deactivation, including progressive muscle relaxation.

Agenda Item: Kentucky United We Learn Council,

Presenter: Karen Dodd, KDE Chief Performance Officer

Summary of discussion: Dodd led a discussion on what a vibrant learning experience looks like, with students sharing their perspectives on hands-on education, community involvement and the importance of real-world applications.

Sophia Langford, J. Graham Brown School (Jefferson County), said, “When I think of a vibrant learning experience, I think along the same vein of something that ties into the real world.” Sometimes, Langford said, what is lacking is “the opportunity to go out and work with real people and actually make a physical difference in the community through your learning.”

“It's important to learn the foundation and the core concept, but it's also important to know why you're learning it and get to actually physically do something with it,” said Langford.

Khoa Ta, Owensboro High School, seconded some of the previous comments, adding he wants to see students applying the skills they are learning in the real world. Ta mentioned that students could use their skills doing community service. He said he thinks a vibrant form of learning or experience should be “hands on education,” whether it is a project in school or community service.
