Agenda Item: Welcome

Presenter: Robbie Fletcher, Ed.D., Commissioner of Education, Kentucky Department of

Education (KDE)

Summary of Discussion: Fletcher welcomed the council and provided several updates. He discussed the impact of recent severe weather on school districts, including flooding in western Kentucky and Pike County, which led to school closures and cleanup efforts. He congratulated Ashley Billiter and CSAC Chair Peter Jefferson for being selected for the U.S. Senate Youth Program, which includes a \$10,000 college scholarship and participation in Washington Week. He announced the first statewide Agriculture Education Week in Kentucky, scheduled for March 17-21, and encouraged elementary schools to engage students in learning about agriculture. He also highlighted the launch of the Futurity website, which helps students find their future career paths, and thanked the Commissioner's Student Advisory Council for their input in improving the website. Fletcher gave an update on the town hall meetings held across the state to gather input on the new accountability system. Fletcher recognized Taylor County bus driver Sam Graham and Latonia Elementary School Administrative Assistant Kim Franks from Covington for their dedication and contributions as classified staff. They are recipients of the 2024-2025 Kentucky Education Support Staff Professional Award and were nominated for the national RISE award. He also praised the Somerset Independent Solar Car Team for their achievements in the national solar car race, highlighting their record-breaking performance.

Summary of Discussion: Fletcher provided updates on the February KBE meeting, including the recognition of Career and Technical Education Month, the Support Education Excellence in Kentucky or SEEK funding program shortfall, and Kentucky Teacher of the Year Jennifer Montgomery's presentation on her background and her goals.

Agenda Item: Agriculture Education Week

Presenter: Bethany Mattingly, Division Director Agriculture Education and Outreach, Department of Agriculture

Summary of Discussion: Mattingly explained the initiatives and activities planned for Agriculture Education Week, including literacy lessons, career exploration and community

involvement opportunities. During Agriculture Education Week, which is March 17-21, younger students will be exposed to ag education in their classrooms.

Member Sharing and Announcements: Chair Peter Jefferson, a senior at Henry Clay High School (Fayette County Public Schools), said he is honored to be representing Kentucky as part of the U.S. Senate Youth Program during Washington Week.
