
School-Based Medicaid

Expanded Care

Medicaid Programs

- School-Based Health Service: This program allows schools to bill for the medically necessary services that a Medicaid-eligible child receives. This program is more commonly known as the fee-for-service program.
- School Based Administrative Claiming: (SBAC) This program offers reimbursement for the costs of administrative activities, such as outreach, that support the Medicaid program.
- **Cost Reporting/Settlement:** Kentucky transitioned to a cost-based approach for the fee-for-service (FFS) program. FFS Cost Reports must be completed annually and are used to compare FFS "interim" payments received throughout the year to actual costs collected on the Cost Report. **Schools are usually underpaid throughout the year and typically receive additional reimbursement.**

What is Expanded Care?


Expanded care (AKA Free Care) allows schools to potentially bill for services provided to Medicaid-eligible children that fall outside the Individual Education Program (IEP)

What does this mean for Kentucky?

April 28, 2019, Kentucky's State Plan Amendment (SPA) was submitted to The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). On Nov. 4, 2019, CMS approved Kentucky's SPA.

Basic Requirements for Billing

- The child must be Medicaid eligible.
- You must have parental consent.
- The child must have a reimbursable service listed in the IEP for traditional School-Based Medicaid.
- ▶ The service must be medically necessary for Expanded Access.
- Practitioners cannot bill if they are paid with 100% federal funds.
- The practitioner must be listed on annual application or an approved amendment.
- This program will not effect Medicaid eligibility outside of the school setting.

Covered Services

The following services currently are eligible for Medicaid reimbursement when provided to a Medicaid-eligible student:

- Nursing
- Audiology
- Speech-Language
- Occupational Therapy
- Physical Therapy
- Mental Health/Behavioral Health
 - School psychologist are now a billable practitioner type
- Orientation and Mobility

Note: Telehealth is approved as a method of delivery Contact tracing is not a covered service.

Caution

- Be cautious of contractual agreements
 - Many factors have to be met for Medicaid reimbursement, so be careful when hiring additional staff
- This program is not meant to recoup 100% of a practitioner's salary and benefits.
 - Ex: Olivia is paid 100% from general funds; her district pays her \$43.62 per hour including salaries and benefits. Her Medicaid unit rate is \$43.62 divided by 4, which is \$10.88. The school district receives an average of \$7.51 (approximately 70/30 reimbursement total) per one unit (1 unit = 15 minutes) of reimbursable direct service therapy provided by Olivia. The district received a total of \$6,500 for Oliva for the entire year of direct service reimbursement. Medicaid's reimbursement of \$6,500 only covers a small portion of Oliva's salary and benefits. This example only includes reimbursement for the School-Based Health Service program.
 - The School-Based Health Services also known as direct Services is the highest reimbursement of the three programs. Please remember that Medicaid reimbursement comes from all three programs.



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
