# House Bill 2

- IT IS PROPOSED THAT A NEW SECTION BE ADDED TO THE CONSTITUTION OF KENTUCKY TO READ AS FOLLOWS:
- *The General Assembly may provide financial support for the education of students outside the system of common schools. The General Assembly may exercise this authority by law, Sections 59, 60, 171, 183, 184, 186, and 189 of this Constitution notwithstanding.*
- **Ballot language:**
- *To give parents choices in educational opportunities for their children, are you in favor of enabling the General Assembly to provide financial support for the education costs of students in kindergarten through 12th grade who are outside the system of common (public) schools by amending the Constitution of Kentucky as stated below?*
- *The General Assembly may provide financial support for the education of students outside the system of common schools. The General Assembly may exercise this authority by law, Sections 59, 60, 171, 183, 184, 186, and 189 of this Constitution notwithstanding.*

# Enacted Bills

- SB 2 (Wise) – student safety & mental health
  - Became law without the Governor’s signature
- SB 11 (Schickel) - juvenile justice
- SB 18 (Deneen) – school bus specifications
- SB 164 (Funke Frommeyer) - allows articulation agreements between licensed proprietary schools and public school districts or state area technology centers
- SB 167 (Tichenor) - require cursive writing to be included as a course of study in all elementary schools beginning in the 2025-2026 school year
- SB 265\* (Deneen) – Option 7 alternative teacher certification pathway
  - HCS1 – adds a new teacher induction and mentor program
- HB 22 (Pratt) - removes the requirement for medical oversight of an AED program
- HB 142 (Hart) – anti-vaping bill

# Enacted Bills – Continued (2)

- HB 162 (Tipton) – numeracy
  - SFA2 - appropriate General Fund moneys in the amount of \$5 million in fiscal year 2024-2025 and \$5 million in fiscal year 2025-2026 to the Kentucky numeracy counts fund
- HB 169 (Palumbo) – AEDs in all school buildings and at school-sanctioned athletic practices and competitions
- HB 300 (Clines) – timelines for complaints to the EPSB
- HB 354 (Johnson) - require the KDE to pay to the KPPA the health insurance premium reimbursements required for retirees who participated in a hazardous position prior to July 1, 2003
- HB 377\* (Banta) - teacher recruitment and retention
- HB 446 (E. Calloway) – student conduct on school buses
  - require local school boards to adopt a transportation services policy
- HB 447\* (E. Calloway) – student transportation via passenger vehicles
- HB 471 (Freeland) - school pre-enrollment for military-connected students

# Enacted Bills – Continued (3)

- HB 535 (Duvall) – civics education
  - allows two civics literacy options for high school graduation beginning with the 2025-2026 school year:
    - a one-half credit in Civics Literacy or a score of 70 percent on a 100 question civics test
- HB 695 (Jackson) – Adaptive Kindergarten Readiness pilot project
- HB 825 (Tipton) – Audit of the KDE
  - Became law without the Governor’s signature
- HB 611 (Bauman) – truancy
  - Filed without the Governor’s signature
- HB 727 (M. Meredith) - general obligation bonds
  - HFA1 – extends the provisions of HB 678 (2022) through June 30, 2027
- HB 387 (Truett) - substitute teacher certification.
  - HB 605 added via SCS1
- HB 449 (Riley) - relates to local boards of education
  - FCCR - removes the limitation on the number of depositories a school district can utilize.
- HB 499\* (McCool) – CTE funding distribution formula
- HB 829\* (Nemes) - medicinal cannabis
  - require each local board of education...to establish policies related to the use of medicinal cannabis by a pupil who is a registered qualified patient on school property by December 1, 2024, and to establish basic standards for school policies related to medicinal cannabis



# Bullying Statute & Requirements

[KRS 158.148](#) defines bullying as

“Any unwanted verbal, physical, or social behavior among students that involves a real or perceived power imbalance and is repeated or has the potential to be repeated:

1. That occurs on school premises, on school-sponsored transportation, or at a school-sponsored event; or
2. That disrupts the education process.



# Statutory Requirements for Local Boards of Education Related to Bullying

KRS 158.148(5) requires local boards of education:

- Be responsible for formulating a code of acceptable behavior and discipline to apply to the students in each school operated by the board. The code shall be updated no less frequently than every two (2) years
- The code shall prohibit bullying and contain:
  - Procedures for identifying, documenting, and reporting incidents of bullying
  - Procedures for investigating and responding to a complaint or a report of bullying
  - A strategy or method of protecting from retaliation a complainant or person reporting an incident of bullying
  - Information regarding the consequences of bullying




