

Superintendent Needs-sensing Survey

Introduction

The Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) is committed to collaborating with districts and providing them with the resources they need to effectively aid student learning. The Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) anticipates that there may be some form of stance learning in the next academic school year (2020-2021). This survey will provide KDE with critical information on anticipated learning needs for your school district as a result of COVID-19 and in anticipation of distance learning. For some of the questions, you will be asked to indicate whether a need is immediate (i.e., should be addressed before school reopens) or may be addressed late (i.e., after schools reopen).

Completion of this survey is voluntary. KDE is not evaluating school districts, nor is KDE monitoring any respondent's compliance with district/county, or state policies. Rather, findings from this research will be used to understand how to better support teachers and students across the state.
