 Per KRS 158.844, a district/school shall use funding to purchase instructional materials for mathematics (including intervention programs and diagnostic assessments) that are <u>High-Quality Instructional Resources</u> (HQIR).

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- The FY22 MAF Mini-Grant funded 75 schools @ \$40,000 for the purchase of HQIR and associated curriculum-based professional learning.

Kentucky Applications Now Open for 2024 U.S. Senate Youth Program

- Applications are now open for the 2024 United States Senate Youth Program, a program that takes the most outstanding high school students from around the country to Washington, D.C., for a weeklong study of the federal government and the people who lead it.
- Two Kentucky high school students will be selected this fall as delegates and will each receive a \$10,000 college scholarship with encouragement to continue coursework in history, government and public affairs.
- KDE oversees the selection process of Kentucky's students.
- High school teachers and principals are encouraged to nominate qualified high school juniors and seniors to apply. Applications are available online and are due Oct. 2.

- Kentucky Commissioner of Education Jason E. Glass announced on July 31 that he will step down from his position on Sept. 29.
- On Aug. 21, the KBE authorized KDE to issue a solicitation for a national search firm that could begin a search for a new commissioner. The request for proposals may be found on <u>Kentucky's Vendor Self Service website</u>.
- KBE is holding a special meeting at 1 p.m. ET Thursday and is expected to name an interim commissioner. You can watch the meeting on the <u>KDE Media Portal</u>.
