Financial Disclosure for Visiting International Teachers in Kentucky

Revised March 2019

Per regulations of the US Department of State’s Exchange Visitor Program ([Federal Register-Department of State 22 CFR Part 62 Exchange Visitor Program](#)), “Sponsors must provide on their main Web sites and in their recruiting materials a general summary of fees and other costs for the program. Teacher Salaries in Kentucky
<p>Unlike the compensation practices in many foreign countries, salaries are not uniform for all teachers in the United States. Salaries vary greatly across each state, including Kentucky, and they are determined by local school districts and educational service centers based on two factors:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Level of educational attainment (university degree); and • Years of full-time, formally-recognized experience.
<p>During the 2018-2019 school year:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Visiting teacher salaries in Kentucky ranged from \$35,000 to \$67,000; and • The average visiting teacher salary was \$43,825. <p>Important: Salaries quoted are gross salaries before any deductions are made.</p>

Disclaimer

The costs described in this disclosure represent statewide averages as of March 2019. Actual costs vary greatly by region of the state and may be less than or exceed the estimated ranges of costs listed here.

Below, the user of this document will find an example of a paycheck and related monthly expenses, which will function as a **general summary of estimated costs** related to the participation of a Visiting International Teacher in the Kentucky Department of Education’s Visiting International Teacher Program.

Paycheck	
Annual Gross Salary • Average visiting teacher salary for 2018-19	\$43,000
Federal Income Tax • Taxable income between \$37,950 and \$91,900 if filing single – 25%	- \$10,750
State Income Tax • On taxable income between \$8,001 and \$75,000 – 5.8%	- \$2,494
Local Income Tax • Average local income tax – 1.75%	- \$752.5
Health Insurance	- \$79.98
Kentucky Teacher’s Retirement System (KTRS) • 12.855% of gross salary	- \$5,527.65
Income after deductions	\$23,395.87
Income per pay period • Average 26 pays per year (every 2 weeks)	\$899.84

The average monthly take-home salary for this income would be \$1,799.68 per month, depending on the number of pay periods.

Notes

In addition to these costs, most visiting teachers will have to pay refundable deposits on rental properties and for some utilities since they will not have an established credit history in the U.S. New visiting teachers coming to Kentucky spend between \$2,500 and \$5,000 of their own funds on initial expenses related to housing, transportation, utilities and other miscellaneous initial expenses.

Ways to reduce expenditures include but is not limited to sharing housing with another visiting teacher if there happens to be one in the area or living with a local host family.

Cars purchased by visiting teachers that have been well-maintained can be sold at the conclusion of their stay in the U.S.
