Cloud migration

The remaining districts with on-premise Campus servers will begin migrating to the Infinite Campus private cloud this spring with all districts' databases scheduled to be hosted in the cloud by the conclusion of summer break. District migration dates and other key information can be found in the Campus Community support case for your district (Subject: Move to Campus Cloud).

To prepare for a smooth migration, districts should do the following:

- At least two months before migration date, district KSIS leaders should meet with key district personnel such as food service and technology staff and create a plan to complete the relevant tasks in the [Kentucky IC Cloud Migration Readiness Guide](#). If district staff have ques-

tions about these tasks, don't hesitate to ask through the Campus Community support case (Subject: Move to Campus Cloud) or by contacting Lisa Rhoton.

- For ODBC/SQL server users, verify that passwords for these accounts are known prior to migration. Infinite Campus can reset passwords if needed; however, addressing password issues prior to the migration is ideal.

KDE and Campus are working to ensure that the mobile app-related migration experience is smooth for the spring and summer migrations.

Ensure that the preschool spring enrollment count is accurate

Please use the Preschool Enrollment Count-Summary and -Detail reports in Infinite Campus to ensure that the enrollment data for your district is correct. KDE will pull the spring enrollment count from Campus on March 13 based on the children enrolled on March 1. You will have a few days after March 1 to make adjustments. To ensure an accurate count, please ask your district staff to lock all IEPs by close of business on March

10.

The preschool spring enrollment count will be based on the children enrolled in the state funded preschool program on March 1, 2017. The average of the fall (Dec. 1) and spring (March 1) enrollment counts will determine SY 2017-18 funding.

The count will include students in grades 99, 98 and 97 enrolled in the preschool program and served in the classroom. More specifically, the stu-

dents counted for funding are at-risk 4-year-olds (up to 160% of poverty) and 3- and 4-year-olds with an active and locked IEP. Students who are actively enrolled on March 1 will be counted, regardless of when they entered the program. This count does not include children who are enrolled in the Head Start program, nor does it include students who are receiving special education services outside the classroom (enrollment type N).

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Student voice updates

Student Voice administration in Infinite Campus ends March 1

The Infinite Campus Student Voice administration period for the 2016-17 school year will end on March 1. After the administration period ends, automatic educator assignment and survey generation will not run, and all surveys must have an SV Window End Date of March 1 or earlier. A school that plans to conduct a survey after March 1 should use another mode consistent with their district's Certified Evaluation Plan (CEP).

Verify school and district profile data for the School Report Card

Please help ensure that personnel in your district responsible for updating the school demographic information are aware of the upcoming verification period.

In preparation for the School Report Card data loads, KDE requests all districts to verify that their 2016-17 school and district profile information is correct before the April 10 opening of the School Report Card Profile page. School demographic and contact information is available online on the [School Report Card](#) and [Open House](#) web pages. These sites provide an important communication tool for your school district and your community.

Verification of school profile data must be done through the District and School Collection Repository (DASCR) application accessible in [KDE Web Applications](#). The [School Change Requests webpage](#) provides instructions and tips for verifying and updating school profile information. Please note that the [Open House on-line school directory](#) uses the DASCR information and updates as KDE approves district changes. Changes made will not affect previously published 2015-16 School Report Card information.

Key Dates

Feb. 1 – April 7	Schools verify school profile information via DASCR.
April 10	2016-17 School Report Card “Profile” data will open to the public.
Summer 2017	KDE will load additional data to the School Report Card Secure site for district review.
Fall 2017	2016-17 School Report Card will open to the public.

CRDC submission system for SY 2015–16 opens Feb. 8

The 2015-16 Civil Rights Data Collection (CRDC) submission system for the Kentucky schools and districts will be open for 75 calendar days. For two weeks, beginning with the opening on Feb. 8 through Feb. 23, districts will review data that KDE has prepopulated into the CRDC submission system. Beginning Feb. 24 schools and districts will verify prepopulated data and must complete the submission process by April 26. KDE will provide updated information and a timeline on the [KDE CRDC webpage](#).

On Feb. 8, each CRDC contact will receive an email from the Office of Civil Rights containing a username and the Web link needed to verify his/her account and create a password in the CRDC submission system.

If you have questions regarding this mandatory data collection, contact the CRDC Partner Support Center (PSC). The CRDC PSC provides technical assistance to school districts on behalf of the U.S. Department of Education. The PSC is available for questions between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. ET. When contacting the PSC, have your seven-digit local education agency (LEA) identifier readily available.

MAP data in the IMS

The Northwest Evaluation Association (NWEA) is preparing an updated file of MAP assessment results that will correct any missing fall data for districts who have signed agreements to have that data display in the Instructional Management System (IMS). NWEA expects the updated file to be available by Jan. 27.

The Instructional Management System (IMS) now has TestNav8

With the TestNav8 online test center, students can take an online test on their PC, Mac, or iPad. Taking a test online is very similar to taking a test on paper.

- Questions can be answered in any order.
- Questions can be skipped and returned to later.
- Questions may have multiple parts.
- Questions may require a response to be uploaded.

You can go back to earlier questions and change your answers.

Tests may include the use of a ruler, calculator, or protractor. If so, a toolbar will appear on the top of your screen to open the appropriate tool.
