2018 Infinite Campus release schedule

The 2018 Infinite Campus release schedule is available on the [KSIS Home webpage](#). All updates are scheduled to occur on the second Wednesday of the month with the exceptions of August and December when, to reduce the impact on school districts during critical data entry periods, the update will occur on the first Wednesday of the month.



Chronic absenteeism reports available in Infinite Campus

Detailed and aggregate chronic absenteeism reports calculate school/district chronic absenteeism data based on full-time equivalency (FTE) attendance and are available in Infinite Campus. KDE defines chronic absenteeism as missing 10 percent or more of enrolled instructional time.

- ▶ The Chronic Absenteeism detail report identifies individual students, or groups of students, who are enrolled any time during the year and meet the definition of chronic absence.
- ▶ The Chronic Absenteeism aggregate report displays the percentage of chronically absent students, or

groups of students, by school/district. The aggregate report only includes students enrolled for at least 10 days in the school/district.

IMS sunset

ESSA news

In this regular section of the *KSIS & More* newsletter, KDE shares information with districts on new and updated data collections required by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) and Kentucky's new accountability system.

- At the Dec. 6 special meeting, the Kentucky Board of Education, based on public feedback, eliminated the option for military readiness in the accountability system.
- For SY 2018-19, elementary schools may continue to schedule multiple courses during a single period. Infinite Campus will add a new field to course and section that elementary schools will use to reflect instructional time to measure opportunity and access in rich curriculum for all students. The KSIS mid-year training includes a course code presentation that will provide additional information.

Intervention tab reminder

In response to SB1 legislation passed during the 2017 legislation session, the following student groups are required to have intervention plans entered into Infinite Campus on the Intervention tab:

- all ESS students (all ESS programming)
- all students served through the Mathematics Achievement Fund (MAF) grant
- all students served through the Read to Achieve (RTA) grant

- all three year+ focus schools- for all students scoring novice on state assessments
- all K-3 student interventions for Tier 2 and Tier 3 in reading, writing, mathematics and behavior (beginning Jan. 1, 2018)

High school records for seniors who did not meet ACT statewide benchmarks will no longer be required entry into the Intervention tab; however, the high school transition interventions must still be provided, and the prog-

ress monitoring and documentation must be maintained at the school level and are subject to review upon request.

Data will be pulled for a quality review on Jan. 30 and March 30. All 2017-18 SY data must be entered by June 30, 2018.

IMS News You Can Use

January 2018

Instructional Management System (IMS) News, a supplement to the KSIS & More newsletter, is focused on IMS & Educator Development Suite (EDS) data quality. IMS & EDS data comes from Infinite Campus, Kentucky's Student Information System (KSIS); therefore, it is important to know how KSIS data is used and the critical need for accuracy.

IMS sunset

Effective Dec. 31, 2017, the Instructional Management System (IMS) School & District Data, Classrooms, and Assessment Admin modules became unavailable to the majority of school districts.

This excludes the eight districts that were identified as needing to maintain access to the IMS through June 30, 2018.

Districts who wish to use the IMS starting July 1, 2018 will have the option to pay for access.

As soon as district cost information is available, KDE will pass this information along to districts.

As a reminder, the Educator Development Suite (EDS) module is still available to all districts until June 30, 2018; after this date, EDS will no longer be available.
