



Solutions that Matter

Carryover Limitation

- Section 1127(a) of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) states that not more than 15% of the funds allocated to a district for any fiscal year may remain available for obligation for one additional fiscal year.
- Districts must ensure that at least 85% of school year 2023-2024 (Project 310K) funds are obligated for activities that occur no later than Sept. 30, 2024.
- As stated in ESSA 1127(c), this carryover limitation does not apply to districts that receive less than \$50,000 in Title I, Part A funds for the fiscal year.



Carryover Limitation Waiver

- Any district wishing to request a carryover waiver for 2023-2024 funds may do so no later than Sept. 30, 2024, by emailing David Millanti.
- The carryover waiver request email must:
 - State that the district requests a waiver of the 15% carryover limitation for school year 2023-2024 funds;
 - Contain the reason for the excess carryover; and
 - Describe a plan for effectively using carryover funds.

Displaying the Fraud Hotline Poster

- ESSA 9203 requires each recipient of a grant or subgrant under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act display, in a public place, the hotline contact information of the Office of the Inspector General (OIG) of the U.S. Department of Education.
- The <u>fraud hotline poster</u> is available on the OIG website.
- The poster should be on display in the district office and all Title I schools.
- Districts must also annually notify employees of their responsibility to report fraud.



Paraprofessional Definition

- Per <u>704 KAR 3:550</u>, a paraprofessional means a classified employee, regardless of school district-assigned job title, who performs instructional support duties which may include:
 - Providing one-on-one tutoring if tutoring is scheduled at a time when a student would not otherwise receive instruction from a teacher;
 - Assisting with classroom management;
 - Providing instructional assistance in a computer laboratory;
 - Providing instructional support in a library or media center;
 - Acting as a translator; or
 - Providing instructional support services under the direct supervision of a teacher.



Minimum Paraprofessional Qualifications

- The minimum qualifications for instructional paraprofessionals working in a program supported with Title I funds are listed in 34 CFR 200.58(c) and 704 KAR 3:550.
- In addition to a secondary school diploma or its recognized equivalent, the individual must meet one of the following requirements:
 - Completed at least two years of study at an institution of higher learning;
 - Obtained an associate (or higher) degree; or
 - Met a rigorous standard of quality and can demonstrate, through a formal state or local academic assessment, knowledge of and the ability to assist in instructing, as appropriate:
 - Reading/language arts, writing and mathematics; or
 - Reading readiness, writing readiness and mathematics readiness.



Who Must Meet Qualification Requirements?

- Paraprofessionals with instructional duties in any program supported by Title I, Part A funds must meet the additional educational requirement.
 - For a schoolwide program, this applies to all paraprofessionals with instructional duties without regard to whether the position if funded with federal, state or local funds.
 - For a targeted assistance program, this applies to paraprofessionals with instructional duties who are paid fully or partially with Title I, Part A funds.
 - Paraprofessionals employed by the district to provide equitable instructional services to eligible private school students.

House Bill 387


- On April 19, Gov. Andy Beshear signed House Bill (HB) 387 into law.
- The bill amends the types of substitute teaching certificates in KRS 161.102.
- Requires the Education Professional Standards Board (EPSB) to provide a one-year emergency certificate for substitute teaching to any applicant with a high school diploma or high school equivalency diploma.
 - Not valid for full-time employment with a school districts as a substitute teacher or the replacement of the teacher of record for more than 20 consecutive instructional days. (See KRS 161.102(5)).



Does House Bill 387 Impact Title I Paraprofessional Qualifications?

- This does not impact the additional education requirements for paraprofessionals working in programs supported with Title I, Part A funds.
- HB 387 relates to substitute teachers, not paraprofessionals.
- The additional paraprofessional educational qualification is a federal requirement specific to schools receiving Title I, Part A funds.
