Parents' Right to Know: Testing Transparency

- Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) 1112(e)(2) requires districts to notify parents of students attending Title I schools of information related to testing transparency at the beginning of the school year.
- This section contains two separate requirements and districts must meet both in order to demonstrate compliance.
 - Right to request information
 - Additional information on required assessments

Testing Transparency: In General

- The district must notify parents that they may request, and the district will provide (in a timely manner), information regarding any state or district policy regarding student participation in any mandated assessments per ESSA 1112(e)(2)(A).
- ESSA also states that the notification shall include a policy, procedure or parental right to opt the child out of such assessment, where applicable.
 - Note: Kentucky districts are not permitted to honor a parents' request to opt-out of statewide testing. Additional information is available in the <u>Testing Opt-out Message</u>.



What to Share with Parents

- The notification should include:
 - Their right to request information on mandatory assessments.
 - Name and contact information where parents can submit requests.
 - Statement regarding the inability to opt-out of statewide testing.
- ESSA does not specify a method for sharing this information with parents.
- Consider making the information available through a variety of means (letter, posting to the district website, including in a handbook, etc.).



Testing Transparency: Additional Information

- ESSA 1112(e)(2)(B) states that each district shall make widely available through public means (including by posting in a clear and easily accessible manner on the district's website and, where practicable, on the website of each school served by the district) for each grade served by the district, information on each assessment required by the state to comply with ESSA 1111, other assessments required by the state, and where such information is available and feasible to report, assessments required districtwide by the district including:
 - The subject matter assessed.
 - The purpose for which the assessment is designed and used.
 - The source of the requirement for the assessment.
 - Where such information is available: The amount of time students will spend taking the assessment, the schedule for the assessment and the time and format for disseminating results.



New Testing Transparency Resource

- The Parents' Right to Know: Testing Transparency resource is now available within the Title I Sample Documents folder on the Title I, Part A Documents and Resources webpage.
- The new resource contains:
 - Overview of the testing transparency requirements.
 - Sample language that can be customized by districts to meet ESSA requirements.
- Districts are not required to use the language provided by Kentucky Department of Education (KDE).
- The new resource replaces the "Sample Notice on Testing Transparency" previously available from KDE.



Template: Testing Transparency in General

Parents have the right to request information regarding any state and district policy regarding student participation in mandatory assessments and the district will provide this information in a timely fashion. Requests for state and [district name] assessment policies can be submitted to:

Template: Additional Information

Beginning in 1990, Kentucky chose to have an all-inclusive assessment system by having all Kentucky public school students participate in annual testing with the results of those assessments included in the state's accountability system for schools and districts. Kentucky tests students on various subjects beginning in grade 3. On average, administering Kentucky's state-level assessments takes less than 1% of the total instructional time in a given school year. The following assessments are required in Kentucky. Please refer to the Kentucky Department of Education's (KDE's) <u>Assessments webpage</u> and individual assessment webpages to obtain the appropriate information to share with parents. The test windows for the current school year are available on KDE's <u>Assessment Support webpage</u>.


