

Kentucky Migrant Education Program

Important Dates and Deadlines:

- Paperwork and administrator training dates are set for Aug. 16-17. The Central and Western regions will hold their training on Aug. 16 at Green River Regional Educational Cooperative from 9 a.m. - 4 p.m. The Southern and Northern Regions will hold their training on Aug. 17 in the Perkins Conference Center Quads on Eastern Kentucky University's campus from 8 a.m. - 4 p.m. Migrant Education Program (MEP) staff and MEP District Contact are required to attend one of the trainings.

Keeping services for Priority for Service (PFS) students consistent

As we were making visits to local migrant education programs this past spring, one of the most common questions was, "How do we log services that are provided by other programs into the WebApp?" When you are logging services not directly provided by MEP staff, you need to log them as "other" services and be sure to list the number of contacts. Adding additional information in the description, such as days and times those services are provided, would also be helpful. These "other" types of services may include but not limited to Response to Intervention, special education pullouts and English Language (EL) pullouts. If you have specific questions about how to log "other" services, please contact your regional coordinator or a migrant consultant at KDE.
