GED® Testing Process for Alternative Education Students

(pursuant to KRS 158.143)

PREPARATION

- Alternative Education Student is defined for this process per KRS 158.135(1). Alternative Education Students are subject to compulsory attendance law per KRS 159.010.
- Staff, school district, and other interested parties assess if the GED® exam will meet the student's needs and conduct instruction.
- The student remains enrolled in the school district and is not served by Kentucky Adult Education.
- The school determines when the student has made sufficient progress to pass the Ready™ tests.

MyGED Account

 School creates a MyGED account for the student via ged.com. All Ready™ and GED® testing is scheduled using this account.

READY TESTING

- Student may take the GED Ready™ tests without age alert approval.
- Student must pass at least one Ready™ test prior to age alert approval.

DOCUMENTATION PRIOR TO GED® TESTING

- School completes Sections 1 and 5 of the KYAE Documentation of Withdrawal form in ink.
- School attaches a letter on school letterhead signed by the superintendent declaring intention to GED® test (letter template attached).
- These two pieces of documentation are scanned and emailed to the GED® Administrator™ at ged@ky.gov.
- If the documentation is correct, the GED® Administrator™ will lift the age alert on the student's MyGED account. If there are errors, the Administrator will notify the sender of the need for corrections.
- Once approved, the Administrator will notify the sender that the age alert has been cleared and that the student may proceed to GED® testing.

GED® TESTING

- Student is scheduled for the GED® Tests with the GED® testing center most convenient to the school.
- GED® Testing is scheduled through the student's MyGED Account.
- Student tests in the testing center in accordance with Pearson VUE testing policies.
