Visuals Can: Reinforce Classroom Instructions

Provide additional support for students with working memory or attention needs

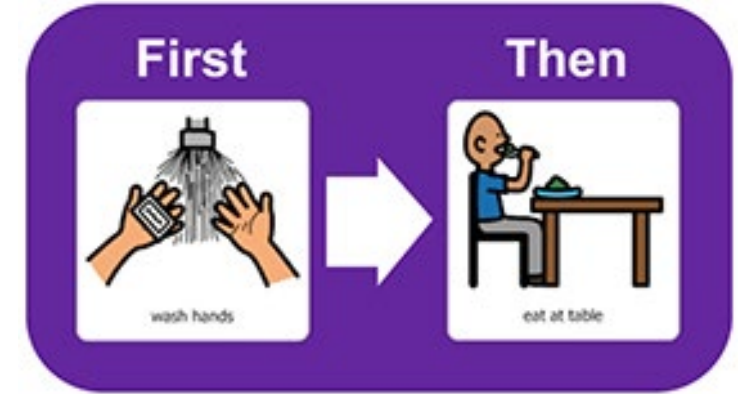
Used to display whole group instructions for an activity or subject

Build independence for students in knowing what to do next

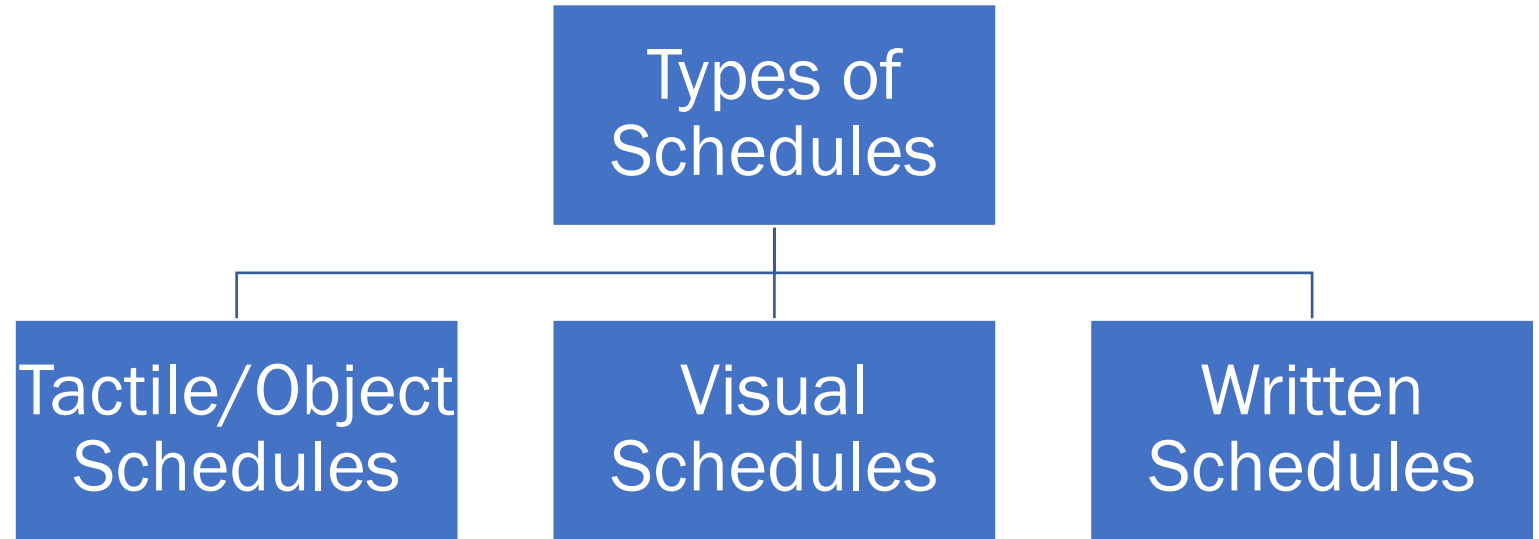
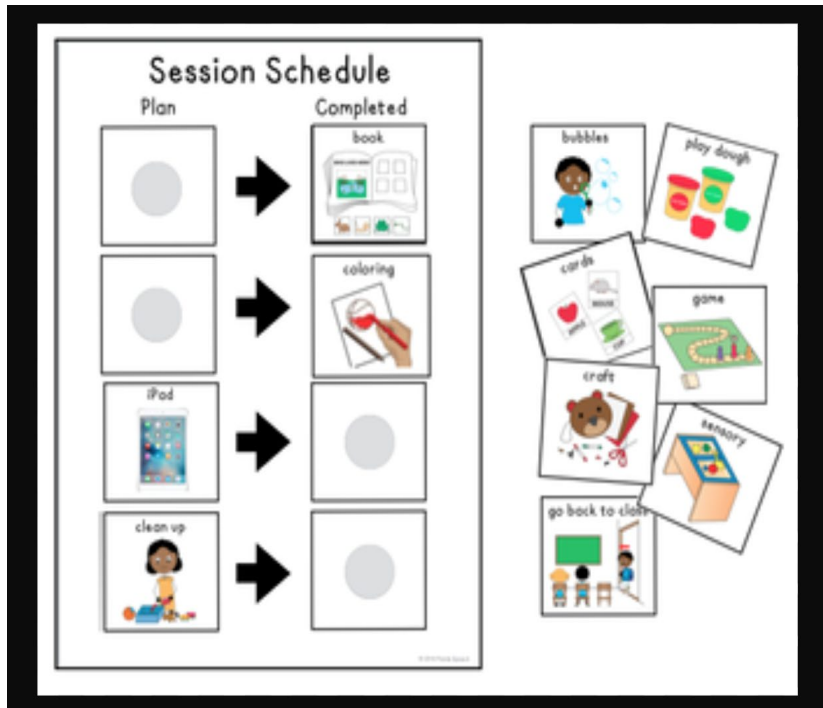


Visuals Can: Provide Daily Structure

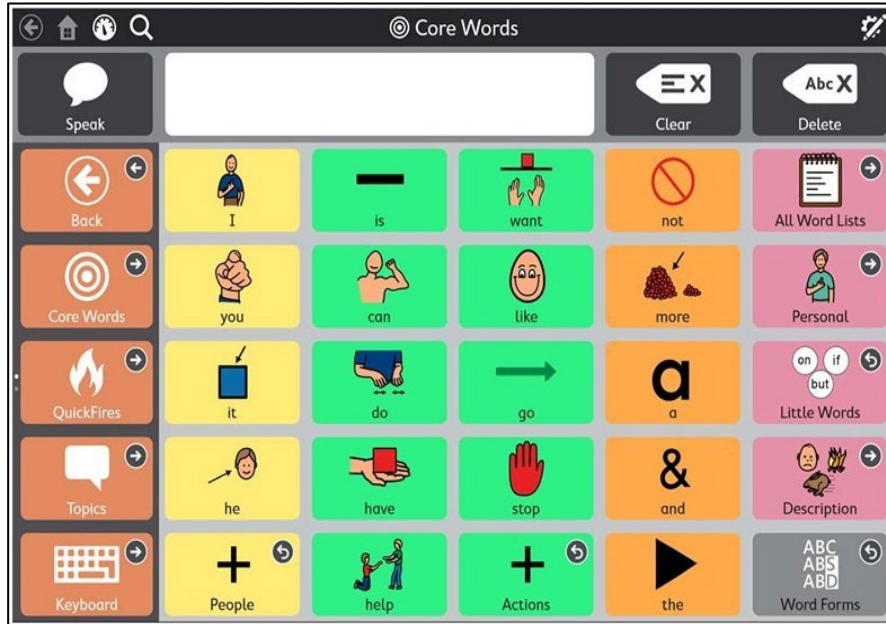

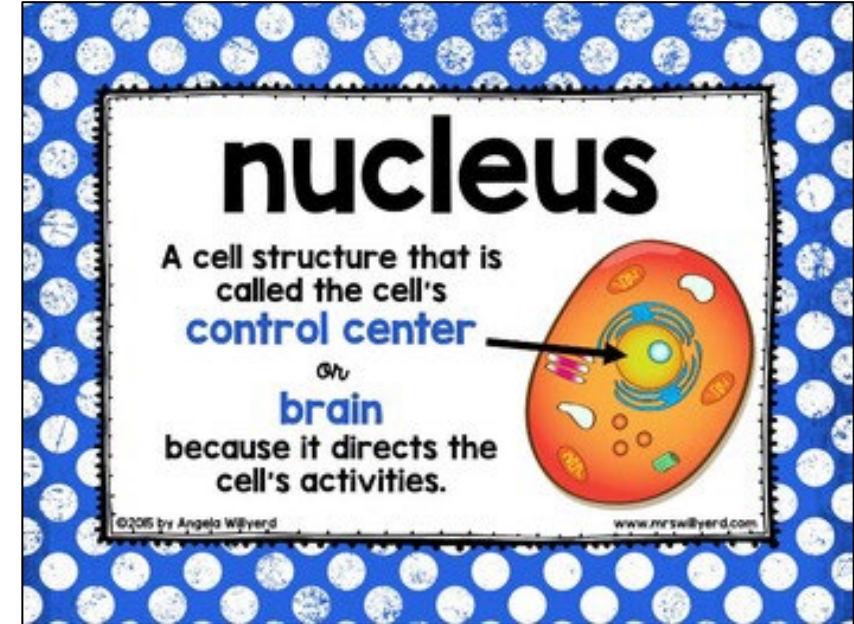
Visuals Can: Be Part of an Individual Schedule
