

Teaching and Learning Career Pathway: Questions and Answers

Q: Where do I find the Program of Studies for the Teaching and Learning Career Pathway?

A: The Program of Studies is located on Teaching and Learning Career Pathway webpage at <http://education.ky.gov/teachers/Pages/Teaching-and-Learning-Career-Pathway.aspx>.

Q: What four courses are required to complete the T & L pathway?

A: Students must complete the following:

- 331030 The Learning Community
- 331031 The Learner-Centered Classroom
- 331032 The Professional Educator

And (1) ONE CREDIT from the following:

- 331033 Collaborative Clinical Experience
- 331034 Principles of Career and Technical Education
- An AP or Dual Credit course in intended teaching discipline

Q: What are the requirements to teach courses in this pathway?

A: All courses could be taught by any teacher with a Rank II and 5 years' experience, except the course Principles of Career and Technical Education (CTE).

Q: How do I complete the LEAD Report?

A: When identifying teachers in the Teaching and Learning career pathway for the LEAD Report, not every certification is listed due to the lengthy list of certifications eligible. **Please submit the report with the error message as long as the requirements listed below are met.** After submitting LEAD, the Certification Branch will manually clear each teacher after verifying that they meet the requirements.

Q: Will this be tracked through TEDS? Do I need to request it as a new pathway in TEDS?

A: Yes, it will be tracked through TEDS. If a school wishes to offer the Teaching and Learning pathway, they will need to work with their school level TEDS coordinator to have it added for the upcoming school year. The window for making requests for the upcoming school year is February 1 – September 1.

Q: Does the student need to complete field experiences in our school with their peers, or any school in the district?

A: A student could complete their field experiences at any school. We hope that students will have a variety of experiences that include grade levels, disciplines, settings, etc.
