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

Purpose: The Teachers Advisory Council (TAC) is designed to improve the educational landscape of Kentucky by providing Kentucky's Commissioner of Education with direct input from Kentucky's classrooms. Bridging the gap between policy and practice, the TAC was created to advise the commissioner on educational priorities so that Kentucky's students are well-prepared for any career they choose. The ultimate goal is to have effective teaching in every school, every classroom, every day.

Membership: The Teacher Advisory Council (TAC) is comprised of approximately twenty (20) teacher leaders from across the Commonwealth who contribute crucial, diverse perspectives on education. Four (4) quarterly meetings take place each year. Members are required to attend at least three of the four meetings to remain an active member of the TAC.

The Office of Educational Licensure and Effectiveness coordinates the application process. Teachers are selected and appointed to the TAC for three-year terms. Membership is prioritized to ensure instructional expertise in various disciplines, grade bands, and areas of specialization are represented on the council. For those interested in applying to serve, please submit the TAC Membership Application. If selected, official correspondence from the Office of Educational Licensure and Effectiveness will be sent.

Accelerate Accomplished Teaching: NBPTS Early Entry Grant in Kentucky

- The Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) is leading the way nationally by participating in a pilot program with the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS).
- This innovative grant will provide 100 early career educators (1 to 3 years teaching experience) with professional learning opportunities to guide and support them through the process of becoming National Board Certified Teachers (NBCTs).
- KDE and NBPTS, as leaders in education, are aware of how important it is to train and retain accomplished educators who are reflective practitioners and who know how to help their students

succeed.

Eligibility

National Board candidates must possess:

- a bachelor's degree
- a valid state teaching license
- three years of classroom or school counselor experience at the end of the certification process

Kentucky Support

- Professional learning and financial support for educators in years 1-3.
- Candidate commits to completing Components 1 & 2 by May 2023, and Components 3 & 4 by May 2024.
- Candidate is willing to commit up to 3 hours a week to engage in asynchronous professional learning.
- Candidates are expected to pay the \$75 registration fee, and Component fees will be covered.



The vision builds around 3 big ideas:

- Creating a more <u>vibrant</u> experience for every student
- Encouraging <u>innovation</u> in our schools
- Collaborating with our communities





- United We Learn is NOT a top-down mandate from KDE.
- The vision was guided from the ground up by listening to Kentucky teachers, students, families, administrators, and community leaders.
- The Commissioner conducted a Listening Tour, including 13 virtual town halls. Following the tour, the Kentucky Coalition for Advancing Education created the *United We Learn* report.

Why United We Learn?

- Students across Kentucky are growing up in a globally interconnected world that is accelerating in competitiveness and possibility.
- Every student has the potential for success, but learning opportunities and outcomes are uneven.
- With United We Learn, we hope for a spirit of constant improvement, innovation, and sharing the best ideas with others.
- What does the future school look like?

Moving from Vision to Action

- Several school districts have programs and initiatives aligned with the United We Learn vision.
- KDE has been awarded \$3 million to help advance innovations to move the state's assessment and accountability system toward a competency-based education model.
- Next steps include establishing the Kentucky United We Learn Council to build an innovative statewide competency-based education model.





 How might the KDE support the field in science and VPA standards implementation?

Review of the Kentucky Academic Standards (KAS)

 KRS 158.6453 calls for the Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) to implement a process for reviewing all academic standards and aligned assessments beginning in the 2017-2018 school year. The schedule calls for one or two content areas to be reviewed each year and every six years after that on a rotating basis.

KAS for Science

- Application for Advisory Panel (AP) and Review Committee (RC) -October/November 2020
- Public Comment Survey on current KAS for Science January 2021
- Initial Vision Setting April 2021
- Committee Meetings to respond to public feedback June 2021-July 2022
- Public Comment Survey on and Focus Groups for DRAFT KAS for Science- July 2022
- Committee meetings to respond to public feedback- August 2022
- Interim Joint Committee on Education (IJCE) and Standards and Assessment Process Review Committee (SARPC)- tentatively fall 2022
- KY Board of Education- tentatively December 2022





KAS for Visual and Performing Arts (VPA)

- Public Comment Feedback Survey December 2021
- Application for Advisory Panel (AP) and Review Committee (RC): February/March 2022
- Selection of AP and RC members April 2022
- First vision setting meeting June 2022
- Committee Meetings to respond to public feedback – July 2022 - present



VII. United We Learn

• Commissioner's Listening Tour- In the spring of 2021, Commissioner of Education Jason E. Glass held a series of 13 virtual town halls to hear from Kentuckians about what is and isn't working in education for them and their families. This was accomplished through empathy interviews conducted by Kentucky students.



 Kentucky Coalition for Advancing Education- A diverse group of more than 60 stakeholders from across the Commonwealth was formed in June 2021 to dig into the information from the town halls and do more empathy interviewing to create a report called United We Learn: Hearing Kentucky's Voices on the Future of Education which has become the vision for education in Kentucky.



• **Kentucky Education Summit-** The statewide summit, held in November of 2021, focused on the future of K-12 education in the Commonwealth. Over two days, the event pulled in some of the nation's top education reform leaders to help begin a discussion about how to build a stronger education system with high standards in Kentucky. We launched the United We Learn vision at the summit.



• **Kentucky United We Learn Council**- This council is currently being formed. Its purpose is to give a broad stakeholder voice to the process of learning from the Kentucky United We Learn work underway in the field and then evaluate and recommend strategic practice, policy and investment ideas to state policymakers and the broader Kentucky community. The commissioner and KBE chair will work with staff, the Kentucky Board of Education and if necessary, the Kentucky General Assembly to respond to the Kentucky United We Learn Council's recommendations.


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KY Geographic Regions. Please use this image to determine the region where your district is located.
