Dear Mr. Rooney and Dr. Kinnard:

Pursuant to <u>34 CFR §200.6 (c)(4)</u>, the Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) submitted the <u>Kentucky</u> <u>Request to Extend the 1.0% Alternate Assessment Participation Waiver</u> to the United States Department of Education (USED). In the submission, the KDE requested approval to extend our 1.0% Alternate Assessment Participation Waiver for all subject areas for the 2021-2022 school year.

Due to the requirement that states submit a waiver extension request at least 90 days prior to the start of the testing window for the alternate assessment aligned with alternate academic achievement standards (AA-AAAS), there was insufficient time to calculate final participation data and disproportionality data from the 2020-2021 school year assessment before the deadline for submission. The KDE's request to extend its waiver included preliminary data from Kentucky's statewide assessment for the 2020-2021 school year. The final assessment data is now publicly available on the <u>Open House</u> website and on the <u>Kentucky School Report Card</u>.

As anticipated, the final assessment data indicates participation in the subject areas of reading, math and science have exceeded, for the 2020-2021 school year, the 1.0% threshold outlined in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). This addendum provides final AA-AAAS participation and disproportionality data for the 2020-2021 school year.

Table 1 displays AA-AAAS participation by subject area for the 2020-2021 school year.

Attachment One includes the number and percentage of all students, including each subgroup of students, who participated in the AA-AAAS in the 2020-2021 school year by subject area.

The U.S. Department of Education granted Kentucky a <u>waiver of statewide assessment, accountability</u> and reporting requirements in the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) for the 2019-2020 <u>school year</u> due to widespread school closures related to the novel Coronavirus disease (COVID-19). This approval allowed flexibility by adjusting the Academic Achievement indicator based on a participation rate below 95.0%. Due to the novel Coronavirus (COVID-19), Kentucky allowed for content based testing exemptions for all state assessments, which impacted assessment participation rates. Therefore, the KDE is requesting approval to waive the 95.0% participation rate requirement for the AA-AAAS. Table Two demonstrates the percentage of all students assessed, including students with disabilities, during the 2020-2021 school year.

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After secure administration of the state assessments, the KDE reviewed data from the 2020-2021 school year with a focus on disproportionality. Students eligible for free and reduced meals exceeded the 2.0 threshold in all subject areas of the AA-AAAS. Table Three includes disproportionality data based on 2020-2021 school year final assessment participation data.
